

**351.03 PROHIBITED STANDING OR PARKING PLACES.**

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with the provisions of this Traffic Code, or while obeying the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (1) On sidewalk, curb or street lawn area, except a bicycle;
- (2) In front of a public or private driveway;
- (3) Within an intersection;
- (4) Within ten feet of a fire hydrant;
- (5) On a crosswalk;
- (6) Within twenty feet of a crosswalk or intersection;
- (7) Within thirty feet of, and upon the approach to, any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic control device;
- (8) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb, or within thirty feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the end of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by a traffic control device;
- (9) Within fifty feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;
- (10) Within twenty feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station and, on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within seventy-five feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs;
- (11) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
- (12) Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- (13) Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a street, or within a street tunnel;
- (14) At any place where signs prohibit stopping, standing or parking, or where the curbing or street is painted yellow, or at any place in excess of the maximum time limited by signs;
- (15) Within one foot of another parked vehicle;
- (16) On the roadway portion of a freeway, expressway or thruway;
- (17) On the fire hydrant side of any residential street;
- (18) On or within the cul-de-sac area of any street.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

**351.031 STANDING OR PARKING VEHICLES ON CERTAIN STREETS.**

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or with the direction of a police officer or traffic control device, within the road right-of-way on the following streets.

- (1) East Main – Lake Street to Bates Road.
- (2) West Main – Eagle Street to Dayton Road.
- (3) North Lake Street – Main Street to Village limit.
- (4) Hubbard Road.
- (5) River Street.
- (6) South Madison Road.
- (7) Saxton Street.
- (8) South Lake Street.
- (9) Middle Ridge Road -- Village limit to Village limit.
- (10) Union Street.
- (11) Eagle Street.
- (12) Burns Road – east side from Middle Ridge to Village limit.
- (13) Bates Road – west side from Village limit to Village limit.
- (14) Dayton Road – east side from Village limit to Village limit.
- (15) Park Street – north and west sides.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

**351.032 ALL NIGHT PARKING PROHIBITED.**

(a) No person shall park any motor vehicle upon any street or highway on the traveled portion thereof at any time, or between the curbs in the business/commercial district on Main Street, between the hours of 3 a.m. and 6 a.m.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.
